### Why the Europe Local Chapter

### What is a Local Chapter

A Local Chapter is a group of contributors willing to join their efforts and promote the goals of a consortium within a community characterized by its geography or its language.

**Mission:** Based on Open Source and Open Standard components, acting as a community, our mission is to foster original OW2 Research and Academic community in Europe, help developing the Europe OW2 Business ecosystem and provide specific support to local community needs.

**Activities:** The mission is carried out through three action tracks: Academia networking, awareness and promotion, and project valorisation.

As such, the OW2 Europe Local Chapter actively works to establish contacts and collaboration between OW2 members throughout Europe (e.g. fOSSa conference) and also to extend the impact of OW2 projects through webinar program.

OW2 is an independent industry consortium dedicated to developing open source code middleware and to fostering a vibrant community and business ecosystem. Building on the legacy of ObjectWeb and OrientWare, OW2 federates more than one hundred organizations and 6000 developers in Europe, Asia and the Americas. OW2 hosts over one hundred technology Projects, including Lomboz, Sync4j, eXo Platform, XWiki, SpagoBI and JOnAS. A typical global open-source organization, OW2 aims to bring together grassroots communities across all continents through Local Chapters. **Local Chapters** are activities carried out to contribute to the sustainable development of business ecosystems on a regional scale, in a business neutral way. They represent OW2 at a regional level under supervision of the Management Office.
